### Moana Site Lease Agreement with SNCA

Reno City Council Meeting Wednesday, July 11, 2012 Beginning at 12pm

On **Wednesday July 11<sup>th</sup>**, the *Reno City staff will present the lease agreement with Sierra Nevada Community Aquatics (SNCA), for the Moana site to the City Council.* With the approval of the City Council, this lease agreement will give SNCA control of 5 of the 22 acres of the Moana site. For the past few years SNCA has been working toward the construction



of a new Aquatics facility and this is the first big step to completing this dream for all of us.

## Olympic Trial Inspiration a Nevada Native

After one of the most anticipated races of the US Olympic Team Trials in Omaha, the men's 400 meter IM, SwimSwam (http://swimswam.com/) reported that "**Michael Weiss** from Wisconsin continued his incredible run from nowhere in the last 6-months by taking 5th in 4:16.31. That's 5-seconds faster than he had ever been coming into this meet."

What SwimSwam failed to realize is that this apparent run from nowhere actually began 18 years ago, in 1994, when Michael learned to swim at Lakeridge Tennis Club. At age 7, Michael competed in his first Nevada State Championships, and while soccer was an integral part of his early athletic development, by the time he was 11, Michael chose to be a swimmer and a swimmer only. His age group career included countless hours, in the pool, at the pool, around the pool, in the sun, the wind, and the rain. During his run from nowhere, he stopped long enough to leave a trail of Lakeridge Swim Team club records and win Nevada State



Championships in a variety of events, from breaststroke to the 1,650 yd freestyle.

He was a Nevada State record holder; Far Western champion and record holder; Pacific Swimming age group record holder; Western Zone champion, record holder, and Swimmer of the Meet; Nevada High School state champion and record holder; Junior National finalist; US National Championships qualifier; and Scholastic All-American.

Since becoming a Wisconsin Badger in 2009, Michael has only picked up the pace. Over the past few years, he has matured as an athlete, embracing the idea that 'Hard work beats talent when talent doesn't work very hard'. As a Badger, he has been a Big-10 Championships finalist and is the current University of Wisconsin school record holder in breaststroke, freestyle, and IM. In 2011, he finished 6th at the US National Championships in the 400 IM, then 3rd at this year's NCAA Championships, also in the 400 IM.

The truth is, Michael Weiss' so-called run from nowhere began in Reno, Nevada, where pools are few and far between and his home pool is just 4 lanes wide and 5 feet deep. As Michael, along with his age group coaches, family, friends, and local swim community well know, a 5th place finish at the

Trials is not only a new milemarker, it's a longtime coming. His 400 IM at the US Olympic Team Trials may have been his best on his 5-event format, 5 seconds faster than his previous best, and the 26th fastest time in the world this year, but swimmers, just like pools, don't come from nowhere; they come from commitment, willingness, hard work, dedication, community, and passion...for the sport of swimming.



As the City of Reno furthers its quest to build a new aquatics facility, Weiss is back in the pool training, preparing for the US Open next month, and the goal of qualifying for next year's World University Games and a top-6 ranking (he is currently 7th) in USA Swimming, where he would find himself on the US National team and looking ahead to 2016.
